CURTIN AVENUE CROSSING

A new crossing to improve safety for pedestrians will be installed at the intersection of Curtin Avenue and Forrest Street early this year. In response to community safety concerns, Town of Cottesloe met with Main Roads WA who agreed to design and construct the crossing. The pelican crossing is controlled by lights that the pedestrian must operate. It will link the bike and pedestrian path on Forrest Street to Cottesloe Train Station.
