## FUNDING TO UPGRADE MARINE PARADE PATH

The Town has been successful in securing funding from the Australian Government's Active Transport Fund (ATF) to upgrade the existing footpath along the length of Marine Parade - from Curtin Avenue to North Street.

\$4.175 million has been secured from the ATF for design and construction works, which will involve widening and upgrading the current path to improve safety and accessibility. It will also improve the connectivity of this popular path, providing a well-designed shared path with high quality connection to other key locations in the Town.

The Marine Parade dual use path has been consistently identified by our community and by Council as high priority in our cycle network, and this significant external funding - which will cover over 95% of the estimated project cost - will enable the Town to get to work on delivering this project.
