Last month 250 people, including Local Government delegates, presenters and exhibitors, converged in Perth for the WA Transport and Roads Forum.

Delegates participated in the future direction of policy, shared strategies, heard the latest updates and engaged with State Government representatives.

A few of the highlights included:

- Town of Victoria Park Chief Executive Officer, Anthony Vuleta's proposal that arriving at the most desirable infrastructure design solutions can be considerably enhanced by asking the customer how they would like to be engaged at the earliest opportunity in the consultation process.
- Dr Theuns Henning demonstrated that the "worst first" policy for road maintenance is not the most effective use of funding and showed that scheduling maintenance for unsealed roads by combining feedback from road users with simple roughness measures provides higher levels of satisfaction than traditional rotational scheduling methods.
- Examples of how different organisations have partnered to deliver a range of outcomes to improve cycling facilities across the State.
- A challenge from Road Safety Commissioner, Iain Cameron, for the whole community to turn our collective minds to how a vision of zero deaths and serious injuries on the roads will be achieved.
- City of Stirling and Shires of Northam and Northampton taking out the 2018 Local Government Road Safety Awards for safety projects implemented in their communities.

Ride Along Tour of the City of Stirling Bicycle Boulevard (Safe Active Streets)

The City of Stirling and GTA Consultants hosted a ride along of the Moorland Street Bicycle Boulevard to share the successes and innovations of the completed Stage 1 and the progress of Stage 2.

Close to 20 participants from other Local Governments, GTA Consultants, Curtin University and WALGA's RoadWise participated in the ride through. Also participating was City of Stirling Mayor, Mark Irwin and Councillor Stephanie Proud.

The group rode from the City of Stirling Civic Building, entered and rode the completed Stage 1 (Odin Road to Huntriss Road) and then continued through

The ride through provided an opportunity to see the infrastructure which has been incorporated into the Bike Boulevard and to find out more about the process, construction and safety initiatives incorporated into the boulevard, with GTA Consultants happy to answer questions.

City of Stirling staff facilitated a discussion about the City's process, lessons learnt during and post construction and the purpose of the route.

City of Melville Uses Courtesy to Remind Drivers to Slow Down

Drivers on the streets in the City of Melville will be getting a courteous reminder to slow down on local roads.

Three new interactive courtesy speed display signs have been installed as part of a program to reduce travel speeds, particularly in residential areas. The signs raise awareness of travel speeds, providing instant feedback on whether drivers are travelling above the posted speed limit.

Evaluation of the effectiveness of the signs in reducing speeds is planned, with early indications showing drivers are slowing down while the signs are in place.

The South West Youth Driver Development Program (YDDP) recently launched a shopfront for the Regional Youth Driver Education (RYDE) program at the City of Bunbury Library.

Wheatbelt Events Target Driver Fatigue

Driver Fatigue was a recurrent theme at Wheatbelt events during October, with six fatigue-focused displays, events and presentations held in Toodyay, Northam and Wongan Hills.

fatigue, which research indicates could be responsible for as much as 20% of the serious injury and fatal road crashes in the Wheatbelt region¹.

Three of the events incorporated a road safety quiz to reinforce the information provided at the road safety display, with the winners at each location receiving a \$50 local fuel voucher. Congratulations to Helen Clemesha of Wongan Hills, Delys Dick of Northam, and Dianne Cox of Toodyay for correctly answering 10 road safety questions as part of the draw.

Fatigue facts:

- After 17 hours awake, we are on our way to sleep: and once fatigue has set in, the only real solution is sleep. Research shows that most people benefit from just a 20 minute nap, so motorists are encouraged to take a break or swap drivers - don't just push on through!
- A three to five second micro-sleep could mean a driver has travelled up to 100 metres at high speed with their eyes closed.²

Kimberley 'See and Be Seen' Signs Can Now be Seen

Main Roads WA (Kimberley) recently installed signage along their sealed road network, complementing existing signage on Local Government controlled unsealed roads.

The message is part of a campaign being run by RoadWise Committees across the Kimberley region to promote vehicle visibility in an effort to improve road safety on local roads.

Broome RoadWise Committee Chairperson, Councillor Warren Fryer said the use of vehicle headlights perform two important functions - they light up the road in front of you (at night and in poor conditions) and also make your car more visible to other road users.
