This annual event is a surfing and cultural event organized by Indigenous Communities Education and Awareness and features a youth surfing competition, skating competition, cultural activities, live music and a celebration of the Wajuk Noongar culture of the Perth area.



## TOWN OF COTTESLOE COMMITTED TO COASTAL PROJECTS

The Town of Cottesloe has been successful in receiving a Coastal Adaption and Protection Grant from the Department of Transport for the third consecutive year.

The \$14,600 grant will allow the Town to continue its monitoring program which commenced in 2014 with the installation of remote camera units at North Cottesloe and Cottesloe Beach. The cameras are programmed to take a photograph every hour during daylight, capturing a visual record of the coastline. The program also includes a beach profile survey every six months, allowing the Town to record changes and patterns along the coastline and to identify coastal trends.

The Town was also successful in receiving a \$20,500 Coastwest and Coastal Management Plan Assistance program grant which will fund



a project to restore a high profile section of the foreshore at Cottesloe Main Beach. This site is an important link to existing and past restoration areas undertaken by Cottesloe Coastcare.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENT PENSIONER CONCESSIONS

As part of the 2015/16 State Budget, the State Government announced that from the rating year commencing 1 July 2016, the 50% concession allowed to eligible pensioners on local government rates would be restricted to a capped amount of \$750 for 2016/17. The pensioner rates capped amounts will be set each year, consistent with the way senior's rates caps are set. The Town of Cottesloe does not administer the laws in regards to pensioner concessions. To lodge a complaint regarding the capping of the pensioner rebate, contact your local Member of Parliament.
