We are pleased to announce that these signs have now been installed. They are located at the top of each beach path and, where it is not visible from beach level, at the bottom of some beach paths. Each BEN sign has a unique code providing specific location information, vital for emergency services. Please take note of the closest BEN sign location and information when you next visit the beach.
