## OPEN FOR COMMENT

Submissions on an application under the State Development Assessment Unit (SDAU) for a development at 140 Marine Parade (the Ocean Beach Hotel) have been extended following a request from the Town and the closing date is now Tuesday, 26 April 2022. The community is encouraged to make a submission at <https://consultation.dplh.wa.gov.au/reform-design-state-assessment/cottesloe-ocean-beach-hotel-da/>.

The State government's proposal regarding the State Development Assessment Unit (SDAU) process and its replacement with a Special Matters Development Assessment Panel is open for public comment until Friday, 22 April. We encourage the community to make a submission to ensure that control of local planning matters remains with the local council and reflects the Town's local planning scheme.

The WA Planning Commission is seeking comments on a proposal to re-zone the McCall Centre at Lot 556 Curtin Ave, Cottesloe. The site is located in the Town of Cottesloe and the Town of Mosman Park and is currently zoned "Public Purpose - special uses reservation". The proposal is to rezone it to "urban", which will allow the land to be used for residential development. The closing date for comment is 5pm, Friday 29 April 2022. ## FOGO IS COMING

We are getting ready to FOGO! FOGO (Food Organics Garden Organics) is the collection of food scraps with natural material from the garden. Green lidded bins currently used to collect garden organics will become Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) bins - both garden organics and food scraps will be collected in this bin. The move to FOGO means that the majority of our food waste will become high quality compost, rather than decomposing in landfill.

FOGO will be introduced in the Town in June. More information - as well as a small kitchen caddy to help you collect kitchen scraps - will be delivered to households during the changeover.
