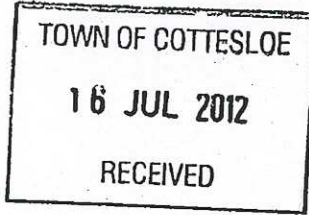

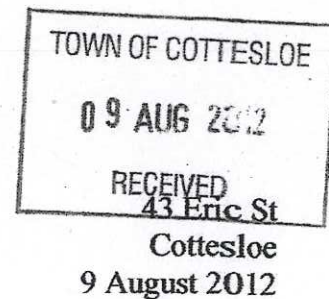

I attended a meeting at Len and Rhonda Weir's house about the parking issue, though most of those concerned were away, so that there is as yet no clear direction from the group.


I would like to comment on my own situation, as the access to my rear garage is onto Chamberlain St. If cars are parked on both sides of the road, I find it difficult to exit or enter the lane without considerable manoeuvring.

My suggestion is that there should be parking available on one side of the road, with permit parking on the other side. A ban on general parking on both sides is rather unrealistic with the changes to the shopping centre.

I gather that the underneath parking area is not usually full, and I believe that it would be sensible if the shopkeepers were to park there, as coffee shop patrons and shoppers will not be parking for the whole day.

With so many coffee shops opening up over the last few years, the Council must have known that parking issues would arise and should have addressed the problems as approvals were being considered.
