TRANSFORM YOUR GARDEN OR VERGE WITH SUBSIDISED PLANTS

There is still time to take part in the Local Native Plant Subsidy Scheme. Until Saturday, 27 May, residents can purchase native plants at a subsidised price of \$1.50 from Apace Revegetation Nursery, 1 Johannah Street, North Fremantle.

The scheme aims to encourage biodiversity and local habitats in the western suburbs. Up to 80 plants (seedlings) can be purchased at the subsidised price, so take advantage of the cooler weather and transform your garden or verge.

This is a Western Suburbs Regional Organisation of Councils (WESROC) initiative. Please take proof of residency when you visit Apace.
