Hello Geoff

Thank you for your request to apply the name Black Cockatoo Lane. Unfortunately the name Black Cockatoo would not be deemed suitable as double barrel names are not permitted. The name Cockatoo is also unsuitable as it has already been applied six times in the Metro area. I looked into the name Carnaby, as it's the Carnaby's Black Cockatoo that inhabits the Swan Coastal Plain. This too cannot be used as there a Carnaby Close in Churchlands 8km away.

This may be an opportunity to honour a past resident who contributed to the Cottesloe community. Below is the link to the Geographic Names Committee Policies and Standards (for Geographical Naming in Western Australia). As this document is regularly updated please check page 61 for the latest version.

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Hi Geoff,

Not sure I can improve on your suggestions for naming the lane between Forrest and Station Street – I am guessing you suggested Briggs and Bullen.

They are both people who have strong links to this particular piece of land (originally named Swan Location 349) and the grounds of the Halfway House then the Albion encompassed this land.

As well as being the publicans there are also other connections that would make them a good choice:

- **BRIGGS** - Thomas Briggs Snr got the first license to the Halfway House around 1870 and stayed until mid to late 1870's. Also Briggs Hall at 88 Forrest Street (north side) built around 1895 was an important community centre and was used for electors meetings, church services and many other events such as dances. It was heavily used around the beginning of the 19th century. I suspect it was built by his son Thomas Briggs jnr – who had a number of lime kilns in the district – would need to verify that.
- **Bullen** – He used this land around the hotel for a number of events – including pigeon shooting and army encampments and it was the site of his proposed pleasure gardens. Another connection to Bullen is that he provided a wooden platform on the site of the current railway station known as Bullen's Siding. It was constructed in 1884 until replaced around 1892 with the Cottesloe station.

Metcalf is also another possibility - on the site of the current BP garage he took over from Mr Winterton in 1947 and was there at least until the 1980's. It's certainly a name that was known around Cottesloe but I don't have any other information on him.

Or maybe Puddle Lane – see the picture below!
